**CONDITIONAL PERMIT FOR "OPEN AIR BURNING"**

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**The Ontario Fire Code Part 2, Article 2.6.3.4 states:**

"Open Air Burning" shall not be permitted unless approved, or used to cook food on a grill or barbecue.

**CONDITIONS**

1. You are requested to contact the **FIRE CONDITION HOTLINE (613) 396-6553** to notify the **Township of Tyendinaga Fire Dispatch** of your intent to burn. They will request your Name, Municipality, Permit #, Type of Burn.
2. You are requested to notify Fire Dispatch when you have completed the burn.
3. A "Campfire" or "Cooking Fire" is an "Open Air Fire", the size is to be no greater than .6 metres X .6 metres X .6 metres (2 feet X 2 feet x 2 feet).
4. Be responsible when conducting "Open Air Burning".
5. Follow the rules and regulations in the "Open Air Burning By-Law" which are not limited only to those which appear on the permit.
6. Do not burn more than one pile, container, etc. at any one time.
7. Size of the fire shall not be greater than 3 metres X 3 metres X 1.8 metres (10 feet X 10 feet x 6 feet high).
8. "Open Air Burning" must be supervised by a competent person at all times.
9. Do not burn if it is windy.
10. Should the weather conditions prevent dispersion of smoke, do not burn.
11. Do not burn garbage, plastics or other materials that give off noxious fumes.
12. You are responsible for controlling your fire, should it get out of hand you may be held accountable for the costs associated with a fire department response.
13. Section 475 (3) of the Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, c25 as amended, authorizes the recovery of costs related to the violation of these provisions.
